Dear friends,

It was good to be gathering together again face to face last Sunday. Even if it meant I had to change out of my slippers this week. Even though it means that we have to convey our joy at seeing each other with our smiley eyes rather than simply our smiles. Even if we have to negotiate our way through, peoples comfort levels with physical distancing. Also I hope those who joined our zoom service on Sunday also feel very much part of us as well.

At the AGM tonight (just a reminder) I will be sharing on Psalm 107: 23-32, part of a Psalm about the Lord guiding people back to Israel after the exile. This section reflects on an epic sea voyage through a stormy ocean (think Paul in Acts 27). The story of Jesus calming the storm in the gospels also comes to mind (Mark 4:35-41). God able to protect and guide people through storms and to a safe haven, it finishes with the people testifying of the goodness and faithfulness of God in that situation. We can trust God in the midst of the storm, as the gospel story tells us to be in the boat with us, but also to be the one who brings us through. But the key point I want to make tonight, and now is that it says at the beginning of the section of Psalm 107 is it is those who go out into the deep who see the wonders of the Lord. It is easy in the sort of difficult times we are in, the stormy weather we face to simply want to batten down the hatches, 'hunker in the bunker' and stay in port, but the call of Christ to us is are we willing to be people who will risk unfurling our sails and heading out into the deep. To go out into the wild waves, keep focusing on the mission that God has for us in these times, as we do we trust the wind of the spirt to fill our sails and the one who can calm the storm to lead us through.

COVID alert level 2

We are now in COVID alert level 2, with the delta variant limits changed to what they were before. We are now able to meet in groups of up to 100. It is mandatory for people to sign in for contact tracing when they come to church, wearing of face masks is highly encouraged. We do acknowledge that for some this is not possible for medical reasons. People are asked to respect those who wish to maintain social distancing, this includes hand shaking etc. Wash hands regularly, and *please stay home if you are unwell*, and exhibiting cold and flu like symptoms. We can serve morning tea at services, but will not serve any food (the COVID exec will review this policy for November). On the government website it tells people traveling to faith gatherings to keep 2 m distance from people they do not know. The government's best health advice is that it is important for people to be fully vaccinated.

We will have services at all three sites this Sunday. At Onerahi and Tikipunga they will be holding our regular fifth Sunday in the Month 'Gospel and Healing Services'. If you would like prayer for healing or know someone who is in need of such prayer, we'd invite you to go to one of these sites. At central we will be continuing with our look at the book of Revelation. Once again we are limited to 100 people so if we are over 100 at central people will be redirected up to the 10am service at Tikipunga. If people are unwell or unable to come please note there will be a zoom service.
