### Dear Hope friends,

Sue and I have just returned from a wonderful 10 days visiting family that we haven't seen for months. My mother celebrated her 90<sup>th</sup> in Taupo where almost all her family were able to gather. We had a memorable celebration with a "this is your life" theme. It was so much fun. Then on to Auckland where we celebrated Christmas with our immediate family in Red Beach. It was such a happy time.

On Christmas day, we attended St Stephens Anglican Church, Stanmore Bay, for their service (NB ... the Presbyterian Church was closed due to covid). At the door we were greeted by an old friend, Rev Dr Don Batley. Long story short, he gave us a book that he had written about the history of the charismatic renewal in the Anglican Church that he had been a significant leader in. It is a fascinating account. In it, I was especially struck by a prayer that the Bishop of Auckland, Rev Gowing, prayed for himself, and also asked all members of the Auckland Diocese to consider praying: "Renew Thy Church, O Lord, beginning with me". Of this prayer he said "This is an extremely important prayer, for if the Church ... is to be renewed, there must be renewal on the individual level – I must be renewed. There must be renewed love for our Lord, a new understanding of Him and His Mission, a new devotion to Him. I must be honest before God and myself. In what ways is my Christianity a formal. Lifeless thing? How are my priorities – where do they depart from those of our Lord? What part has mission in my life?" He then went on to say "I ask that these questions be pondered not only in private but they be considered in groups". I am not sure that Bishop Gowing had a charismatic renewal in mind ... but this did break out in the 1970s right across all denominations in NZ bringing renewal to the Church. !

As we begin a New Year, maybe we can take our eyes off the many challenges that covid has presented and turn to the Lord and pray "Renew Thy Church, O Lord, beginning with me". Let's keep our eyes on Jesus and ask Him to fill us afresh daily with His Holy Spirit, who is the Spirit of Renewal. Let's ask Him to lead us to become the Church He would have us be – a church that has a new love for God, a new understanding of Him, a new devotion to Him ... and His Mission.

- We have moved into the new government COVID suppression plan (AKA traffic light system) Northland is under Red at the moment.
