Dear Friends,

What it means to have faith and trust in God in the midst of a pandemic is a question I often wrestle with. It's one I am often asked about as well. So it's been on my mind and I thought I'd risk simply writing down some of my thoughts this week. Hopefully you'll find it helpful and challenging.

The first is that God is sovereign and in control and working his plans and purposes out in the world. I have found preparing a sermon on revelation 4, which is a vision of the throne room in heaven very helpful. We may have a sense that things are dark and chaotic, however we need to raise our eyes and see the greatness of God. Viruses along with all other natural things are created, God is the creator.

I am helped by the immanence of God, that God is with us, Jesus words in Matthew 28 as he sends his followers out to make disciples is 'and lo (sorry I'm old enough to sometimes thing in king James English) I am with you to the end of the age'. In my scripture reading in Job today I was reminded of that God spoke to Job out of the storm.

Also we can have faith and trust in God because of his prevenient grace, another word is God's providence, not only does God create the world he sustains it. That is manifest in many practical ways.

Firstly, God has made the human body with all its abilities to fight off virus' etc. We can live trusting God by living a healthy life style. How we eat, exercise, our life balance, health supplements etc. Now one look at me and you know this is an area I struggle with. This year I am challenged and inspired with the fact that Lorne has bought an e-bike and comes to work on it each day.

Secondly, God has gifted humanity with such wisdom and understanding that we are able to do all the wonderful things which we call science. That is a gift from God, it comes from humanity being made in the image of God. So for me things like vaccines and medicine are ways God has provided for us. As a diabetic insulin is one of those things. One of my most vivid childhood memories is of having the English Measles. Having a high fever, lying in bed as the ceiling in my room seemed to come down and then spring back up and out to a great distance. The MMR vaccine our children had helped to make that a non-endemic illness in New Zealand. Likewise understanding how viruses are transmitted etc and treatments that are available for the symptoms of an infection, while not an exact science, helps us as a community and country. Science and medicine is not perfect however, We do need to see medicine and science as a gift from God, the challenge is that others see it as making us God like.

Thirdly, government, yes government. Hopefully good government, people who are able in the midst of things like the pandemic to enact public health regulations that are going to be as effective as possible in keeping the population safe. In fact a quick read through the Old Testament law will show you that public health regulations have been around for a very long time. Israel as a people who lived in tents in the wilderness and later together as a nation needed regulations to keep themselves safe from disease and epidemics. Now it does not mean I agree with everything that a government regulates, and I find myself really perplexed and upset with some of the mandates at the moment. But government is one of God's prevenient graces.

Then prayer and trust in God also become very important. That faith element, alongside the other things. My trust in God however does not mean that I am not going to be cautious with how I go about expressing that faith publically (ie with public worship). It's interesting I've read some articles recently that have quoted works that looked at the 1918 flu pandemic. What we are facing now and

how we have dealt with it are not that different. The church's stopped meeting face to ace in many places, to stop the possibility of transmission. In the mid-west of the US, newspapers, the mass media of the day, printed sermons and prayers and hymns for people to stay connected and to worship together in their homes. On the other hand, in one Spanish town the catholic bishop decided that the people needed to get together and pray. They did it in a very 'Old School' catholic way with kissing relics and stuff, while his people admired his faith the death rate in the town from the flu was the highest in the country.

The last thing, sorry this is so long, is that while I find myself focused on the pandemic much of the time, it is to once again lift my sight and look at God's calling and mission in the midst of what is going on. To be prepared to keep on doing what God has called me, and us as a church to do and be. To plan for ministry, mission and growth, work at caring for people, and continuing to faithfully preach and proclaim God's word. To live faithfully.

Now that really only scratches the surface, I hope it helps with your reflections on the topic. I am always happy to get feedback and to discuss things raised in these pastoral emails.
