As the season of prayer came to an end I was reminded of the story of Queen Bertha of Paris, who was married to King Ethelbert of England. She was a Christian and in her marriage agreement it was stated that she could practise her religion and her husband, a pagan king, would grant her access to a priest for communion. Her husband rebuilt St Martin's church in Canterbury for her and she faithfully walked from the palace each day to the chapel to pray for England to become Christian, and her husband. By the end of her life Rome had Sent St Patrick to 'Christianise' England (he was more known for his work in Ireland). Her husband did become a Christian (strange reason was he saw how hard his Christian Soldiers fought... not something you'd encourage these days) but the Christian faith being reintroduced to England and having a great impact can be traced back to faithful prayer. Keep praying.

Pentecost Sunday was a great time together and people left the service having been uplifted by God's presence. We still miss those who because of differences over COVID choose to be apart from us, they are loved and missed. It bought up a great issue to have, what to do when we have children in our services again. It also showed how blessed we are with musicians who can lead both traditional church music and worship with a more contemporary feel. May God continue to encourage us by his presence by the Holy Spirit, energizing us and enabling us to witness to Jesus, risen from the dead.
