Greetings everyone across our three communities – Tikipunga, Onerahi & Central.

Howard and Kris both are at home with covid, and so I (Lorne) am writing this week's pastoral email.

What a blessing it was to have a day off work yesterday ... to celebrate the life and service of Queen Elizabeth. The Queen was a faithful servant of God right to the end of her life. She also is remembered for her joyful spirit, her infectious smile and serenity where she had the capacity to put people at their ease.

One amusing story of her was here in New Zealand in 1983 on a Royal visit. She had been working hard and was to have a secret day off on Motuarohoia Island in the Bay of Islands. Four Policemen were sent in civvies with their dogs to clear the island of visitors for security reasons, and so the Queen could be on her own without any formal engagements. They themselves were to be scarce when she arrived.

It started to rain heavily and so they thought the Queen wouldn't come. So they left their boat and took shelter in a house called the Eagles Nest. They had a couple of cans of beer, then heard a noise. It was the Queen coming to shelter in the house. They all hid. One man, Sgt Harvey Fergusson, hid behind a curtain in the bathroom. The Queen went in to the bathroom and found him. She looked at him and exclaimed with a smile "Are you hiding?" to which he replied "Yes ma'am". Well now you have found me, it must be your time to hide"! Apparently she let out a huge belly laugh.

When Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden, they hid from God. They were ashamed. They were afraid to face God.

Genesis3:8-10

"The man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?" He answered, "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid."

Adam and Eve obviously thought that God would not find them! But He did. He knew everything about them ... He knows everything about us too.

When you think about it - It's a silly thing to try and hide from God! The psalmist tells us that He knows our very thoughts and a word before we speak it. We can hide from Him in all sorts of ways — our habits, our thoughts, our grief and sadness's, our motives for our actions, our secret sins etc. But we have no need to hide as His purpose is to help set us free and enjoy fellowship with us.

Jesus said: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30)

I find it most reassuring that I can be completely honest with Him about my own issues and shortcomings. He longs, like God in the garden, to have unbroken fellowship with us. Why not take a few moments to bring to the Lord those things that you may have been hiding from Him... and receive the Lord's rest and peace.
