Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Lorraine Greenwood keeps in close contact with him and wrote to me saying Last week, Rev Lawrie Hampton turned 97! I keep in touch regularly, and have received a newsy letter from him today with the attached photo, taken on THE Day with Jocelyn(wife). Lorraine also included an extract from Lawrie's letter that she felt we would find interesting and also inspirational, as Lawrie and Jocelyn are



doing so well, both dealing with the limitations of older age and also seeming to be keeping up with modern technology...

"We had no great family-wide celebration of my ninety-seventh birthday. Jocelyn worked hard to provide a slap-up afternoon tea here in our villa. Ross (son)was able to be present...A pleasant time together. And of course, there were many birthday greetings from family and friends, near and far.

For our years, we are reasonably well and active, but those years have recently taken their toll on our mental and physical powers. We have both given up driving and we have a car no more. This means that we are largely confined to our village, and, indeed, to our villa. We have no family member living any nearer to us than in Auckland. Kind friends drive us to church and home again but for other outings we must rely on taxis – medical and dental appointments, and special shopping needs, for example. Food supplies we order on line from the local supermarket, who deliver to our door."

Pauline Hampshire is at Te Maungarongo Ohope Marae this week for a week looking at Maori theology with rev Dr Wayne TeKawa a presbyterian Minister and lecturer in theology at Otago University. The Ohope Marae is a special place as it is not a tribal marae but the



church marae and home of the Māori synod of the PCANZ, Te Aka Puaho. It is a special place and I have spent many Easter's there with youth camps for the then Bay of Plenty Presbytery. It was a real blessing to start our Easter Camps by being welcomed on to the marae. The Wharenui (meeting house) is also a very special place. It is a fully carved house with the pillars in the house itself representing the twelve apostles. The Tekoteko (carved figure at the top of the Wharenui) who is the revered ancestor at the head of the house, carries a cross and is Ihu karaiti (Jesus Christ) with the maihi (front barge boards) his arms welcoming us all in. If you get the chance to visit the marae I would highly recommend it to you.

I wonder how many of us like ... dancing?! One of the interesting modes of worship in the scriptures is dancing! Miriam led the people of Israel in dance once the people were safely through the Red Sea (Exodus 15:20). King David danced before the Lord when he brought the ark of the covenant into Jerusalem (2 Samuel 6:14). In one of the most often quoted psalms of worship (Ps 150) we read "4 praise him with timbrel and dancing, praise him with the strings and pipe...".

So dancing is not frowned on by God as it can be an expression of joy and worship in the right context. I am sure that many of the people who were miraculously healed in the Bible jumped and danced for joy?! The cripple who was healed in Acts c 3 possibly danced! "... and he entered with them into the temple, walking, and leaping, and praising God"

Many of you may be aware that during the pandemic, a song and dance titled "Jerusalema" went viral, and many hundreds of organisations around the world danced to it?

Jeruslama is a gospel song ... sung in Zulu ... and the meaning of the words are:

"Jerusalem is my home, (Lord) guide me, walk with me, do not leave me here." This is a timely song and dance given the strife in Israel right now ... but also a reminder for believers in Jesus, that of our true home is in heaven (Phil 3:20; Hebrews 11:3 and 1 Peter 2:11).

We would like to attempt this dance / song in the gospel and healing service on October 29th and invite you to watch and learn the steps ... and join in if you would like to on the day!!!
