PS:- On Monday I was out at McLeod's Bay and it was great to see a Matuku Moana or a Pacific Reef Heron. There are between 300-500 Reef Heron's in New Zealand so they are quite rear (although the population has been quite stable for the past 40 years).

They are smaller and stockier that the more common White Faced Herons. There bills are shorter and thicker and their legs are green. There eyes are yellow/orange colour.

They don't normally have a crest, this heron is simply standing with its back to the wind, which is blowing its feathers up... could be why it looks so upset.
