I was down in Auckland for the *ABIDE* conference last week. The conference was put on by the Laidlaw Center for Church Leadership and held at the Anglican cathedral in Parnell. It was attended by over 400 church leaders from around New Zealand and from a vast spread of different traditions, styles and wings of the church.

One of the highlights was being lead in worship in English and Te Reo by Aaron Hardy and Te Rautini, their worship music is available on Spotify and apple music. The new album is called *Te Awa Kaiora*. One morning we also had Andrew Campbell, Lorne Campbell's son lead us in worship. It was also good to hear from speakers such as Pete Greig, who many of you will know from the video series we have run in our connect groups (the Prayer course, the unanswered prayer course and the lectio course). The challenge was that for many it was the most challenging time for leadership in the church, there was a move around the church and world to devotion to prayer, and in the face of all the challenges facing the church at the present time there is a sense of a 'careful awakening'. One verse which spoke out to me was from Job 14:7-9. ⁷ "For there is hope for a tree,

⁹ Yet at the scent of water it will bud

And bring forth branches like a plant.

Speaking of even old trees sprouting with new growth at the 'scent of water'... a hope of the living water flowing from God's presence mentioned in Ezekiel 47, picked up by Jesus in John 8:37-39 when he says "'If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'"

It was also good to catch up with Malcolm and Cheryl Bollen, who took a break from walking from Cape Reinga to Bluff to attend. They had just completed 800km of that journey and crossed over Pirongia in the Waikato the day before.
