As part of the continued missional connection between HopeWhangarei and Te Aroha Noa medical centre, staff members from the church take devotions at Te Aroha Noa on Tuesday mornings. With Malcolm and Cheryl away on their pilgrimage walking the length of New Zealand I thought for my devotions I would walk through the psalms of ascent (120-134). Psalms that would have been used by pilgrims heading to Jerusalem for one of the three big festivals each year.

This week we looked at Psalm 124, which is a communal psalm of praise for God's continued help for Israel as a community, and for people individually. It finishes with an affirmation that God is our help in times of difficulty and trial. When it says that our help is in the name of the Lord, it speaks of our help from God being dependent on his very character.
